Preschool

The Preschool Program is free to district families and registration is on a first come, first serve basis in the spring. Children who are four by August 1 may enroll in the Preschool program which runs five half days per week. Post-Secondary PN Program

Cass Career Center's Practical Nursing Program is a 10.5 month program that offers the education needed for students to sit for the NCLEX, which is the nationwide examination for the licensing of nurses. The CCC PN program is currently fully approved by the Missouri State Board of Nursing and accredited by the Council on Occupational Education.

Community Education

The Community Education program offers a variety of courses during the fall and spring semesters including trade & technical, enrichment, health & fitness, computer, safety, and digital photography. Class participants have the opportunity to explore careers in health care with courses such as medical coding and phlebotomy, which allow students to sit for certification exams upon completion of the course.
