# 72 STUDENTS EARN INDUSTRY RECOGNIZED CREDENTIALS & 86 EARN MARKET VALUE ASSETS IN AG PROGRAM THIS PAST YEAR

The Cass Career Center Agriculture Program students gained Industry Recognized Credentials through the Missouri Agriculture Skills and Knowledge (MOASK) Assessment Program. 72 students passed industry driven hands-on evaluations in areas such as Ag Mechanics, Dairy Cattle, Farm Business Management, Horse Evaluation, Livestock Evaluation, Poultry, and Soils.

In addition, 86 students earned Market Value Assets (MVA). Through the Kauffman Foundation grant received by the Harrisonville School District, students complete experiences and gain certifications which will be beneficial as they enter the workforce in their future. Students in the Ag Program earned MVA by passing the National Safe Tractor & Machinery Operations Certification, the Bobcat Skidsteer Certification, or the MOASK Industry Recognized Credential.

Students in the Ag Program also had the opportunity to gain college credit in Agribusiness Management from State Fair Community College and Advanced Livestock Management from the University of Central Missouri.



### SUPERVISED AG EXPERIENCE (SAE)

Students select out-of-class SAE programs based on their career interests. Students are supervised by the agriculture instructors, their parents, and employers in the agriculture industry who have an interest in seeing students succeed. Agriculture students through their SAEs, generated over \$358,780 income last year.

The instructors made 221 supervisory contacts with students throughout the year. This equated to an average of 1.7 visits per student.

The most common SAE projects were: 1) Placement in Animal Science, 2) Placement in Plant Science, 3)

Placement in Ag Mechanics, 4) Owning an Ag Business (lawnmowing, etc.), 5) Horse Production.

During each visit, the student and instructor met on a one-on-one basis to discuss

- Project and career advise
- Revising SAE goals
- Reviewing financial recordbook
- Providing recommendations
- Course work and FFA Leadership Development
