Foundation golf tournament adds a twist

For 14 years, the Foundation has hosted the Alumni & Friends Golf Tournament as part of Homecoming weekend. This year's tournament will be a bit different as it will offer golfers more flexibility and enable them to choose a participation day and time that fits with their busy schedules.

The 2017 tournament will be a "My Time" tournament. Golfers and teams may choose any date between Sept. 15 and Oct. 31 to play their round of golf.

Golfers must call Hoots Hollow at 380-4920 to schedule a time and date to play once they have their tickets. "Blackout" dates apply to days when the course has tournaments or leagues playing.

Golfers can register as individuals for \$80 or \$320 for a team, and sponsorships are available.

Sponsors may choose from three different support levels: True Wildcat (\$1,000), Royal Blue (\$500) and White (\$125). True Wildcat sponsors will receive eight (8) golf tickets, Royal Blue sponsors receive four (4) golf tickets, and White sponsors will receive one (1) golf ticket. All sponsors will receive publicity on all tournament materials including the tickets, Foundation newsletter and a news release sent to the local papers.

Sponsors can give out the golf tickets as they choose: incentives for employees, appreciation gift for customers and so forth. The tickets do not



have to be used together unless golfers want to be eligible for tournament prizes.

If your team would like to be eligible for tournament prizes, then the team score must be emailed to jill.filer@harrisonvilleschools.org by Nov. 1. Winners will be announced via email and social media on Nov. 3. Prizes will be available for the top team in the A Flight and B Flight.

Tournament tickets will be available on Tuesday, Sept. 12 and can be mailed to you, or you can pick them up at the school district admin office, 503 S. Lexington. Call to make your team reservation at Hoots Hollow (any day of the week). Then, present your ticket when you arrive to play. Tickets include green fees and cart rental.

DeVenney named Educator of the Year

During the district's End-of-the-Year Celebration in late May, Harrisonville High School social studies teacher Eric DeVenney was named the 2017 Educator of the Year.

DeVenney just completed his 17th year of teaching at HHS. He has a bachelor's and a master's degree from the University of Missouri and a specialist's degree from the University of Central Missouri.

DeVenney was selected for the honor by a panel of judges from outside the community who interviewed four finalists. The finalists were chosen by the Harrisonville Public School Foundation and district administration selection committee from nominations received from parents, students, and Harrisonville Schools' staff members.

Nominations for DeVenney said, "Mr. DeVenney believes that every student has unlimited potential and works with



each of them to help them recognize their strengths. He has stern but gentle guidance. He truly thinks of the students as his family and is invested in their futures."

The Harrisonville Public School Foundation presented DeVenney with a \$500 grant. He also received a plaque and a ring

from Josten's. In mid-July, he was named a finalist for Central Regional Teacher of the Year.

Middle school students awarded Foundation scholarships

Two Foundation scholarships are presented annually to eighth-graders at Harrisonville Middle School. The scholarship recipients are announced at the school's end-of-the-year assembly and then disbursed to the recipients upon graduation from Harrisonville High School.

The Katie Rios Memorial Scholarship is a \$1,000 scholarship funded through annual gifts from middle school staff and the Rios family. The scholarship is presented based on the student's character, attitude, academics, and citizenship. This year's recipient was David Rios.

The Donna Pfautsch HATS Scholarship was also presented. The HATS (Harrisonville Academically Talented Student) Scholarship is awarded to an eighth grade HATS student based on academic excellence; diverse personal, academic, and community interests; a love for learning; and use of talent, imagination, and teamwork to accomplish goals, address challenges, and solve problems. The 2017 recipient was Nathanael DeVenney.

Foundation awards family, endowed

The Harrisonville Public School Foundation presented \$27,300 in scholarships at the 2017 Senior Excellence in Academics Ceremony on May 11.

Harrisonville High School senior Austin Campbell was awarded the Virginia and Stephen Childress Athletic Scholarship. This scholarship, in the amount of \$1,500, is based on athletic and academic achievements, as well as community and school activities.

Campbell was a captain on the state football championship team and was named First Team All-State. He also earned fifth place at state in wrestling this year and was named to the Academic All-State team. He has been on the Principal's Honor Roll all four years. He is the son of Jim and Becky Campbell.

Mr. Stephen Childress served 30 years at the Harrisonville High School as coach, teacher, and administrator from 1942 to 1972. Both he and his wife, Virginia, were avid supporters of the Harrisonville Schools athletic program. Their children, Dudley Childress and Marianne Rusk, endow the scholarship through the Harrisonville Public School Foundation.

Baylee Streit was the recipient of the Allison W. Smith Memorial Scholarship for \$2,000. The intent of this scholarship award in memory of Allison Smith is to encourage and support a senior female student athlete who strives for excellence in academics and sportsmanship, a student who demon-

strates passion to engage in the world through leadership and/or innovative ideas to make the global and/or local community better for others. Streit's school activities include varsity soccer, varsity swim, band, drumline, Freshman Mentoring, National Honor Society, SkillsUSA, National Technical Honor Society, and Criminal Justice/CSI.

She was the president of band, co-chair of Freshman Mentoring (FMP), vice president of NHS, and captain of the drumline and swim team. She was also a four-year Excellence in Academics recipient.

She is the daughter of Steven and Michelle Streit. The Allison W. Smith Memorial Scholarship is funded through annual gifts to the Harrisonville Public School Foundation from the Smith family.

Streit was also the recipient of the Steve Catron Memorial Scholarship. This scholarship, in the amount of \$300, is awarded to an HHS senior who excels in music and athletics.

This scholarship is given in memory of 1979 HHS graduate Steve Catron and was established through memorial gifts in his honor to the Harrisonville Public School Foundation.

Harrisonville High School seniors Austin Campbell, Jake Holden, Micaela Roberts and Aubrey Valentich were awarded the William G. and Nettie Z. Deacon Family Scholarships. These scholarships, in the amount of \$2,000, are awarded to HHS seniors based on academic achieve-

ment, good citizenship, and financial need.

Campbell was a captain on the state football championship team and was named First Team All-State. He also earned fifth place at state in wrestling this year and was named to the Academic All-State team. He has been on the Principal's Honor Roll all four years. He is the son of Jim and Becky Campbell.

Holden's school activities include National Honor Society, DECA, Student Council, and varsity tennis. He was president of NHS, a representative for Student Council, and the treasurer for DECA. He was a four-year Excellence in Academics recipient. He is the son of Lon and Ginger Holden.

Roberts was the secretary for National Honor Society and a Freshman Mentor. She was also a member of the dance team, show choir, and Academic Club. She is the daughter of Karen and Drew Roberts.

Valentich was involved in Music Makers, Key Club, Student Council, Students Against Destructive Decisions, National Honor Society, and Science Club. She was the activities director for Key Club and a student representative to the HHS Bright Futures Council. She is the daughter of Steve and Connie Valentich and Jennifer Valentich.

The William G. and Nettie Z. Deacon Family Scholarship is funded through a gift to the Harrisonville Public School Foundation from the estate of Will Ella Deacon, daughter of William G. and Nettie

Harrisonville High School senior Spencer Proch was awarded the John and Wanda Foster Construction Trades Scholarship. This scholarship, in the amount of \$500, is awarded to an HHS senior based on academic achievement and the recipient's plan to study building trades, architecture, civil engineering, or other related field.

Proch is an Eagle Scout and was a member of the Cass Career Center FFA trap shooting team. He is planning to attend Business and Technical College to become a lineman. He is the son of Todd and Sherry Proch.

Harrisonville High School senior Zach Bolinger was the recipient of the John and Wanda Foster Agriculture Scholarship. This scholarship, in the amount of \$500, is awarded to an HHS senior who has been active in the Cass Career Center agriculture program and/or the FFA chapter.

Bolinger served as the CCC FFA chapter parliamentarian. He earned his State FFA Degree and has been named a Star Area Farmer. He's also been a member of the Cass County 4-H and served as historian and treasurer. He's earned Grand Champion FFA Shorthorn Steer, Grand Champions Shorthorn Cow, and Grand and Reserve Champion FFA Bred and Owned Heifers at the Missouri State Fair. He also served as captain of the wrestling team this year. He is the son of Scott and Diane Bolinger.

The John and Wanda

Foster Construction Trades and Agriculture Scholarships are funded through endowments gift to the Harrisonville Public School Foundation from John and Wanda Foster.

Harrisonville High School senior Micaela Edwards was awarded the Bob Hodge Achievement Award.

This scholarship has the potential to provide Roberts with up to \$10,000 as she will receive \$4,000 the first year and have the opportunity to renew the scholarship for \$2,000 each year for the next three years.

Roberts was the secretary for National Honor Society and a Freshman Mentor. She has also been a member of the dance team, show choir, and Academic Club. She is the daughter of Karen and Drew Roberts. Roberts plans to attend the University of Missouri-Kansas City to major in psychology.

The Bob Hodge Achievement Award is presented annually to an HHS senior in honor of Bob Hodge, a long-time Harrisonville Schools teacher, coach, and administrator.

This scholarship endowment was established with the Harrisonville Public School Foundation through the bequest of an anonymous Harrisonville High School alumnus.

Criteria for the scholarship include academic achievement (ACT score of 25 or higher), acceptance at a Missouri state college or university, excellent citizenship, community involve-

ment, and financial need.

Harrisonville High School senior Justin Hurst was awarded the 2017 Cara Roberts Memorial Scholarship for \$1,000. This scholarship is given to an HHS senior who will attend the University of Central Missouri and who demonstrates a desire to make a difference in the lives of others.

Hurst was involved in the criminal justice/CSI program at Cass Career Center, SkillsUSA, Music Makers, and Students Against Destructive Decisions. He plans to attend UCM to major in Criminal Justice. He is the son of Roger and Lori Hurst.

The Cara Roberts Memorial Scholarship is funded through annual gifts to the Harrisonville Public School Foundation from the Roberts family.

Harrisonville High School senior Wyatt Maxwell has been awarded the Scott T. Morse Memorial Scholarship. This scholarship, in the amount of \$1,500, is based on academic achievement, school or community involvement, and the recipient's determination to overcoming a hardship.

Bright Futures Harrisonville has been recognized as the top Bright Futures affiliate in the nation. At the Bright Futures USA Community Engagement Conference in early March, Harrisonville was named the Affiliate of the Year for 2017.

At the Evening of Champions on March 2, Bright Futures Harrisonville Advisory Board members Bill Kirkemo, Kevin Shelton, and Deb Welhoff accepted the Affiliate of the Year Award - the premiere award of the night. Bright Futures Harrisonville was also a finalist in the Partner of the Year category (Commerce Bank) and the Evan Yoder Spirit of Service Award (Shelley Jansen and Vanessa Hargrave - Just4Me summer food program founders). Bright Futures USA is composed of more than 50 affiliates around the United States.

Bright Futures Harrisonville was recognized for working to meet students' needs through a variety of programs; striving to build

awareness and educate the community regarding the initiative's mission and students' needs; and making a concerted effort to grow opportunities for service learning.

Bright Futures Harrisonville began in 2012 with the purpose of helping students achieve success by matching student needs with resources through partnerships between the schools and the community. An advisory board composed of community members - representing the partnership areas of social-human services, faith-based, parents, business, and school - oversees the initiative's work. Councils at each school that are created in similar fashion meet monthly to focus on student needs within that building.

Bright Futures programs developed to meet basic needs include the Cats Basement, a clothing and school supply resource area; the Food 4 Thought weekend backpack program; the Just4Me summer food program; snack pantries at each

school; the back-to-school fair; and the Stuff the Bus School Supply Drive.

Additional Bright Futures programs seek to provide positive adult role models for students and engage the community through volunteering. These include Game, Study, and Lunch Buddy programs.

Initiatives are also in place to support students' positive self-image, including Star Stations at all elementary schools where students who may not have the resources at home to get ready for the school day can go to do just that and the Make-a-Cake for Kids program, which provides a personalized birthday cake delivered to a student's home on his or her special day.

Bright Futures Harrisonville encourages giving back through its #My42 campaign. The concept is that everyone can give "42" each month whether it be 42 minutes of time, \$42, or 42 items. Through this and other service learning opportunities, students are learning about needs within the community and how they can help.
